Fire Safety Plan

FIRE - Elementary Room - Kid's Building:

Fire GO Signal: White flashing light (on ceiling or wall) with piercing alarm sounds

* * * Never wonder if it is a drill or false alarm. * * * When fire alarm sounds,
ALWAYS EXIT THE BUILDING AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE!

- 1. Immediately gather up the emergency backpacks, radio (power it on), class roster (if available), and quickly do a head count of total kids and Dream Team.
- 2. Remove and two people (adults first) put on the safety vests out of the Primary Backpack.
- 3. Remove the safety rope out of the Primary Backpack and give the command ROPE UP
- 4. In the front of the Primary Emergency Exit door, have the students line up and grab ahold of the safety rope.
 - a. NOTE: There are two ropes connected together by a carabineer. If your class is not large enough to require both ropes unhook the ropes leaving the second rope in the classroom and only use one. If your class needs both ropes leave them connected together.
 - b. If you have more kids than rope, have kids hold the hands of a kid holding onto the rope.
- 5. Exit out the room's primary evacuation route door with a safety vested adult in front and a safety vested adult at the back of the line.
- 6. Walk South between the buildings, turn left (East) to walk behind the East building to the East Patio.
- 7. Do a kid check to make sure all kids are present and accounted for.
- 8. Check over the children to make sure there are no injuries to report. If there are injuries, use the first aid kit from the Primary Backpack. If there are serious injuries, treat the best you can, get word to Children's Ministry Lead, Safety Team member, or an identifiable emergency personnel (radio, if not present).
- Continually hold up the GREEN laminated sign or if nighttime activate GREEN glow stick from the Primary Backpack if everyone is present and accounted for and NO immediate attention is required.
- 10. Continually hold up the **RED** laminated sign or if nighttime activate **RED** glow stick from the Primary Backpack if <u>NOT</u> all kids are present and accounted for or if immediate attention is required.
- 11. If cold or inclement weather, remove and layer the Mylar and wool blankets from the Blanket Backpack covering the kids.
- 12. When parents come to pick up their children, make sure you match tag numbers and place child's tag on the Child Release Form (last page on clipboard) before allowing

- children to be released (see attached example at the end of this document or manual).
- 13. If no tag, have parents step to the end of the line while they obtain their driver's license or photo ID to show you. Wait for the CM Lead to verify parent's ID and obtain parent signature on the Child Release Form (last page on clipboard) before releasing the child.
- 14. Once all the kids from your class have been released check with other classes to see if you can assist.

FIRE - Kitchen - Kid's Building

Fire GO Signal: White flashing light (on ceiling or wall) with piercing alarm sounds

ALWAYS EXIT THE BUILDING AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE!

- 1. Immediately gather up the emergency backpacks, radio (power it on), class roster (if available), and quickly do a head count of total kids and Dream Team.
- 2. Remove and two people (adults first) put on the safety vests out of the Solo Backpack.
- 3. Remove the safety rope out of the Solo Backpack and give the command ROPE UP
- 4. In the front of the Primary Emergency Exit door, have the students line up and grab a hold of the safety rope.
- 5. Go out the doors on the West building entrance doors and continue walking South between the buildings, then East / left to the East Patio.
- 6. Do a kid check to make sure all kids are present and accounted for.
- 7. Check over the children to make sure there are no injuries to report. If there are injuries, use the first aid kit from the Primary Backpack. If there are serious injuries, treat the best you can, get word to Children's Ministry Lead, Safety Team member, or an identifiable emergency personnel (radio, if not present).
- 8. Continually hold up the **GREEN** laminated sign or if nighttime activate **GREEN** glow stick from the Primary Backpack if everyone is present and accounted for and NO immediate attention is required.
- 9. Continually hold up the **RED** laminated sign or if nighttime activate **RED** glow stick from the Primary Backpack if <u>NOT</u> all kids are present and accounted for or if immediate attention is required.
- 10. If cold or inclement weather, remove and layer the mylar and wool blankets from the Blanket Backpack covering the kids.
- 11. When parents come to pick up their children, make sure you match tag numbers and place child's tag on the Child Release Form (last page on clipboard) before allowing children to be released (see attached example at the end of this document or manual).

FIRE - East Auditorium - Kid's Building

FIRE - Growth Track Room - Main Building

- 1. Immediately gather up the Solo Emergency backpack, radio (power it on), class roster (if available), and quickly do a head count of total kids and Dream Team.
- 2. Remove and two people (adults first) put on the safety vests out of the Primary Backpack.
- 3. Remove the safety rope out of the Primary Backpack and give the command ROPE UP
- 4. In the front of the Primary Emergency Exit door (West stairs), have the students line up and grab a hold of the safety rope. (If you have more kids than rope, have kids hold the hands of a kid holding onto the rope).
- 5. Exit out the Primary Emergency Exit door with a safety vested adult in front and a safety vested adult at the back of the line.
- 6. Walk South toward the grass area behind the buildings and head East / Left toward the East Patio.
- 7. Do a kid check to make sure all kids are present and accounted for.
- 8. Check over the children to make sure there are no injuries to report. If there are injuries, use the first aid kit from the Primary Backpack. If there are serious injuries, treat the best you can, get word to Children's Ministry Lead, Safety Team member, or an identifiable emergency personnel (radio, if not present).
- Continually hold up the GREEN laminated sign or if nighttime activate GREEN glow stick from the Primary Backpack if everyone is present and accounted for and NO immediate attention is required.
- 10. Continually hold up the **RED** laminated sign or if nighttime activate **RED** glow stick from the Primary Backpack if <u>NOT</u> all kids are present and accounted for or if immediate attention is required.

ALWAYS EXIT THE BUILDING AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE!

- 1. Immediately gather up the Solo Emergency backpack, radio (power it on), class roster (if available), and quickly do a head count of total kids and Dream Team.
- 2. Remove and two people (adults first) put on the safety vests out of the Primary Backpack.
- 3. Remove the safety rope out of the Primary Backpack and give the command ROPE UP
- 4. In the front of the Primary Emergency Exit door, have the students line up and grab a hold of the safety rope. (If you have more kids than rope, have kids hold the hands of a kid holding onto the rope).
- 5. Exit out the closest safe door with a safety vested adult in front and a safety vested adult at the back of the line.
- 6. Walk South toward the grass area behind the buildings and head East / Left toward the East Patio.
- 7. Do a kid check to make sure all kids are present and accounted for.
- 8. Check over the children to make sure there are no injuries to report. If there are injuries, use the first aid kit from the Primary Backpack. If there are serious injuries, treat the best you can, get word to Children's Ministry Lead, Safety Team member, or an identifiable emergency personnel (radio, if not present).
- Continually hold up the GREEN laminated sign or if nighttime activate GREEN glow stick from the Primary Backpack if everyone is present and accounted for and NO immediate attention is required.
- 10. Continually hold up the **RED** laminated sign or if nighttime activate **RED** glow stick from the Primary Backpack if <u>NOT</u> all kids are present and accounted for or if immediate attention is required.
- 11. If cold or inclement weather, remove and layer the Mylar and wool blankets from the Blanket Backpack covering the kids.

TORNADO - Elementary Room - Kid's Building

Tornado GO Signal: When town sirens are activated / NOAH Radio declares a Tornado emergency. *Phase ONE* will be a verbal instruction from CM Lead or Safety Team Member. *Phase TWO* will be a megaphone siren blast in the hallway or a verbal command issued from CM Lead or Safety Team member.

PHASE ONE: Staging for a Tornado Emergency

- 1. Immediately gather emergency backpacks, radio (power it on), class roster (if available, do not wait).
- 2. Do a quick head count of total kids and Dream Team members.
- 3. Remove and two people (adults first priority) put on safety vests out of the Primary Backpack.
- 4. Shut and Status YELLOW lock all doors.
- 5. Gather and seat the kids in the storage area behind the stage.
- 6. Adults and teens should be mixed in amongst the kids and await the next status change from the Children's Ministry Lead, Safety Team member, or an identifiable emergency personnel.
- 7. Prep the wool blankets for quick and easy deployment if necessary.

- Have kids assume the tornado tuck position on all fours with your head down and your arms covering/protecting your head and neck.
- 2. Using the wool blankets previously staged from the Blanket Backpack, cover the kids (if there are more kids than blanket coverage, have the kids turn put their head and shoulders under the blanket, like petals on a daisy. The point is to protect the air they are breathing).



Tornado Tuck

- 3. When the situation is "ALL CLEAR" the following will happen:
 - a. The Children's Ministry Lead, a Safety Team member, or An identifiable emergency personnel person will unlock the door and give instructions on how to best dismiss or evacuate the building.
 - Make sure every child is present and accounted for and check for injuries. If there are injuries, use the first aid kit from the Primary Backpack and get word to Children's Ministry Lead, Safety Team member, or an identifiable emergency personnel.

- 4. If an evacuation order is given, initiate the standard RBfK evacuation protocol.
- 5. Give the command **ROPE UP** while removing the safety rope out of the Primary Backpack.
 - a. There are two ropes connected together by a carabineer. If your class is not large and will not use both ropes unhook the ropes leaving the second rope in the classroom and only use one.
 - b. If your class needs both ropes leave them connected together.
 - c. If you have more kids than rope, have kids hold the hand of a kid holding onto the rope.
- 6. Once the kids have grabbed a hold of the safety rope, take the children, emergency backpacks (re-pack the wool blankets into the Blanket Backpack), radio and class roster (if available) out the Elementary room's SECONDARY evacuation route door,
 - a. through the kitchen, out the West building doors,
 - b. walk South between the buildings,
 - c. turn left / East and continue to the East Patio wait for help and parents.
- 7. Do a kid count to make sure all kids and Dream Team are present and accounted for.
- 8. Check over the children to make sure there are no injuries to report. If there are injuries, use the first aid kit from the Primary Backpack. If there are serious injuries, treat the best you can, get word to Children's Ministry Lead, Safety Team member, or an identifiable emergency personnel (radio, if not present).
- Continually hold up the GREEN laminated sign or if nighttime activate GREEN glow stick from the Primary Backpack if everyone is present and accounted for and NO immediate attention is required.
- 10. Continually hold up the **RED** laminated sign or if nighttime activate **RED** glow stick from the Primary Backpack if <u>NOT</u> all kids are present and accounted for or if immediate attention is required.

Tornado GO Signal: When town sirens are activated / NOAH Radio declares a Tornado emergency. *Phase ONE* will be a verbal instruction from CM Lead or Safety Team Member. *Phase TWO* will be a megaphone siren blast in the hallway or a verbal command issued from CM Lead or Safety Team member.

PHASE ONE: Staging for a Tornado Emergency

- 1. Immediately gather emergency backpacks, radio (power it on), class roster (if available, do not wait).
- 2. Do a quick head count of total kids and Dream Team members.
- 3. Remove and two people (adults first priority) put on safety vests out of the Primary Backpack.
- 4. Shut and Status YELLOW lock double hallway doors.
- 5. Gather and seat the kids near the interior North wall, West side, with about a 10 foot space between the kids and the door.
- 6. Adults and teens should be mixed in amongst the kids and await the next status change from the Children's Ministry Lead, Safety Team member, or an identifiable emergency personnel.
- 7. Prep the wool blankets for quick and easy deployment if necessary.

- Have kids assume the tornado tuck position on all fours with your head down and your arms covering/protecting your head and neck.
- 2. Using the wool blankets previously staged from the Blanket Backpack, cover the kids (if there are more kids than blanket coverage, have the kids turn put their head and shoulders under the blanket, like petals on a daisy. The point is to protect the air they are breathing).



Tornado Tuck

- 3. When the situation is "ALL CLEAR" the following will happen:
 - a. The Children's Ministry Lead, a Safety Team member, or An identifiable emergency personnel person will unlock the door and give instructions on how to best dismiss or evacuate the building.
 - b. Make sure every child and Dream Team member is present and accounted for and check for injuries. If there are injuries, use the first aid kit from the Primary Backpack. If there are serious injuries, treat the best you can, and get word to Children's Ministry Lead, Safety Team member, or an identifiable emergency personnel (radio, if not present).
- 4. If an evacuation order is given, initiate the standard RBfK evacuation protocol for this room.
- 5. Give the command **ROPE UP** while removing the safety rope out of the Primary Backpack.
 - a. There are two ropes connected together by a carabineer. If your class is not large and

will not use both ropes unhook the ropes leaving the second rope in the classroom and only use one.

- b. If your class needs both ropes leave them connected together.
- c. If you have more kids than rope, have kids hold the hand of a kid holding onto the rope.
- 6. Once the kids have grabbed a hold of the safety rope, take the children, emergency backpacks (re-pack the wool blankets into the Blanket Backpack), radio and class roster (if available) and exit out the East Auditorium's Primary Evacuation Route door,
 - a. Walk South between the buildings,
 - b. Turn left / East and continue to the East Patio wait for help and parents.
- 7. Do a kid count to make sure all kids and Dream Team members are present and accounted for.
- 8. Check over the children to make sure there are no injuries to report. If there are injuries, use the first aid kit from the Primary Backpack. If there are serious injuries, treat the best you can, get word to Children's Ministry Lead, Safety Team member, or an identifiable emergency personnel (radio, if not present).
- Continually hold up the GREEN laminated sign or if nighttime activate GREEN glow stick from the Primary Backpack if everyone is present and accounted for and NO immediate attention is required.

Tornado GO Signal: When town sirens are activated / NOAH Radio declares a Tornado emergency. *Phase ONE* will be a verbal instruction from CM Lead or Safety Team Member. *Phase TWO* will be a megaphone siren blast in the hallway or a verbal command issued from CM Lead or Safety Team member, or a communication from the radio.

PHASE ONE: Staging for a Tornado Emergency

- 1. Immediately gather Solo Emergency Backpacks, radio (power it on), class roster (if available, do not wait).
- 2. Do a quick head count of total kids and Dream Team members.
- 3. Remove and two people (adults first priority) put on safety vests out of the Primary Backpack.

- 4. Gather and seat the kids:
 - a. In the Nursery, under the stair frame, Southeast corner of the room,
 - b. Or, if the Nursery is locked or unavailable, move to the main restrooms across the hall from the Nursery.
 - c. The last adult/teen inside the Nursery should STATUS YELLOW lock the door behind them.
- 5. Adults and teens should be mixed in amongst the kids and await the next status change from the Children's Ministry Lead, Safety Team member, or an identifiable emergency personnel.
- 6. Prep the wool blankets for quick and easy deployment if necessary.

- Have kids assume the tornado tuck position on all fours with your head down and your arms covering/protecting your head and neck.
- Using the wool blankets previously staged from the Blanket Backpack, cover the kids (if there are more kids than blanket coverage, have the kids turn put their head and shoulders under the blanket, like petals on a daisy. The point is to protect the air they are breathing).

- 8. Check over the children to make sure there are no injuries to report. If there are injuries, use the first aid kit from the Primary Backpack. If there are serious injuries, treat the best you can and get word to the Children's Ministry Lead, Safety Team member, or an identifiable emergency personnel (radio, if not present).
- Continually hold up the GREEN laminated sign or if nighttime activate GREEN glow stick from the Primary Backpack if everyone is present and accounted for and NO immediate attention is required.

PHASE ONE: Staging for a Tornado Emergency

- 1. Immediately gather Solo Emergency Backpacks, radio (power it on), class roster (if available, do not wait).
- 2. Do a quick head count of total kids and Dream Team members.
- 3. Remove and two people (adults first priority) put on safety vests out of the Primary Backpack.
- 4. Gather, move down the stairs, and seat the kids:
 - a. In the Nursery, under the stair frame, Southeast corner of the room,
 - b. Or, if the Nursery is locked or unavailable, move to the main restrooms across the hall from the Nursery.
 - c. The last adult/teen inside the Nursery should STATUS YELLOW lock the door behind them.
- 5. Adults and teens should be mixed in amongst the kids and await the next status change from the Children's Ministry Lead, Safety Team member, or an identifiable emergency personnel.
- 6. Prep the wool blankets for quick and easy deployment if necessary.

- Have kids assume the tornado tuck position on all fours with your head down and your arms covering/protecting your head and neck.
- 2. Using the wool blankets previously staged from the Blanket

- 5. Give the command ROPE UP while removing the safety rope out of the Solo Backpack.
 - a. If you have more kids than rope, have kids hold the hand of a kid holding onto the rope.
- 6. Once the kids have grabbed a hold of the safety rope, take the children, Solo Emergency Backpack (re-pack the wool blanket into the Solo Emergency Backpack), radio and class roster (if available) out the East Auditorium's Primary Evacuation Route door,
 - a. Walk South between the buildings,
 - b. Turn left / East and continue to the East Patio wait for help and parents.
- 7. Do a kid count to make sure all kids and Dream Team members are present and accounted for.
- 8. Check over the children to make sure there are no injuries to report. If there are injuries, use the first aid kit from the Primary Backpack. If there are serious injuries, treat the best you can and get word to the Children's Ministry Lead, Safety Team member, or an identifiable emergency personnel (radio, if not present).
- Continually hold up the GREEN laminated sign or if nighttime activate GREEN glow stick from the Primary Backpack if everyone is present and accounted for and NO immediate attention is required.
- 10. Continually hold up the **RED** laminated sign or if nighttime activate **RED** glow stick from the Primary Backpack if <u>NOT</u> all kids are present and accounted for or if immediate attention is required.
- 11. If cold or inclement weather, remove and layer the Mylar and wool blankets from the Blanket Backpack covering the kids.
- 12. When parents come to pick up their children, make sure you match tag numbers and place child's tag on the Child Release Form (last page on clipboard) before allowing children to be released (see attached example at the end of this document or manual).
- 13. If no tag, have parents step to the end of the line while they obtain their driver's license or photo ID to show you. Wait for the CM Lead to verify parent's ID and obtain parent signature on the Child Release Form (last page on clipboard) before releasing the child.
- 14. Once all the kids from your class have been released check with other classes to see if you can assist.

TORNADO - Kitchen – Kid's Building

Tornado GO Signal: When town sirens are activated / NOAH Radio declares a Tornado emergency. *Phase ONE* will be a verbal instruction from CM Lead or Safety Team Member. *Phase TWO* will be a megaphone siren blast in the hallway or a verbal command issued from CM Lead or Safety Team member.

PHASE ONE: Staging for a Tornado Emergency

- 1. Immediately gather the Solo Emergency backpack, radio (power it on), class roster (if available, do not wait).
- 2. Do a quick head count of total kids and Dream Team members.
- 3. Remove and two people (adults first priority) put on safety vests out of the Primary Backpack.
- 4. Gather, move, and seat the kids through the door in the kitchen into the storage are behind the stage in the Elementary Room. The last adult/teen inside the storage area should STATUS YELLOW lock the door behind them.
- 5. Adults and teens should be mixed in amongst the kids and await the next status change from the Children's Ministry Lead, Safety Team member, or an identifiable emergency personnel.
- 6. Prep the wool blanket for quick and easy deployment if necessary.

- Have kids assume the tornado tuck position on all fours with your head down and your arms covering/protecting your head and neck.
- 2. Using the wool blankets previously staged from the Blanket Backpack, cover the kids (if there are more kids than blanket coverage, have the kids turn put their head and shoulders under the blanket, like petals on a daisy. The point is to protect the air they are breathing).

- 3. When the situation is "ALL CLEAR" the following will happen:
 - a. The Children's Ministry Lead, a Safety Team member, or An identifiable emergency personnel person will unlock the door and give instructions on how to best dismiss or evacuate the building.
 - b. Make sure every child and Dream Team member is present and accounted for and check for injuries. If there are injuries, use the first aid kit from the Primary Backpack. If there are serious injuries, get word to Children's Ministry Lead, Safety Team member, or an identifiable emergency personnel (radio, if not present).
- 4. If an evacuation order is given, initiate the standard RBfK evacuation protocol.
- 5. Give the command **ROPE UP** while removing the safety rope out of the Solo Backpack.
 - a. If you have more kids than rope, have kids hold the hand of a kid holding onto the rope.
- 6. Once the kids have grabbed a hold of the safety rope, take the children, Solo Emergency Backpack (re-pack the wool blanket into the Solo Emergency Backpack), radio and class roster (if available) out the Elementary room's SECONDARY Evacuation Route door,

back out through the kitchen / storage room door, exit out the main doors on the West side of the Kid's building.

- a. Walk South between the buildings,
- b. Turn left / East and continue to the East Patio wait for help and parents.
- 7. Do a kid count to make sure all kids and Dream Team members are present and accounted for.
- 8. Check over the children to make sure there are no injuries to report. If there are injuries, use the first aid kit from the Primary Backpack. If there are serious injuries, treat the best you can and get word to the Children's Ministry Lead, Safety Team member, or an identifiable emergency personnel (radio, if not present).
- Continually hold up the GREEN laminated sign or if nighttime activate GREEN glow stick from the Primary Backpack if everyone is present and accounted for and NO immediate attention is required.
- 10. Continually hold up the **RED** laminated sign or if nighttime activate **RED** glow stick from the Primary Backpack if <u>NOT</u> all kids are present and accounted for or if immediate attention is required.
- 11. If cold or inclement weather, remove and layer the Mylar and wool blankets from the Blanket Backpack covering the kids.
- 12. When parents come to pick up their children, make sure you match tag numbers and place child's tag on the Child Release Form (last page on clipboard) before allowing children to be released (see attached example at the end of this document or manual).
- 13. If no tag, have parents step to the end of the line while they obtain their driver's license or photo ID to show you. Wait for the CM Lead to verify parent's ID and obtain parent signature on the Child Release Form (last page on clipboard) before releasing the child.
- 14. Once all the kids from your class have been released check with other classes to see if you can assist.





- 10. Quickly move anything possible in front of the door to create layers of defense.
- 11. Grab the fire extinguishers to use as a potential defensive weapon (see instruction video at rbfk.net)..
- 12. Post adults by the main entrance door and the kitchen door. Post up between doors and kids
- 13. Get prepared to **aggressively fight** (hear me say destroy) any threat that presents itself. Your goal is for you and the kids to survive this awful and evil event. If evil is breaking into your room, your survival is totally up to you.
- 14. When the situation is given an "ALL CLEAR" the following will happen:
 - 1. Stay in place until the Children's Ministry Lead or an identifiable emergency personnel has given the RBfK all clear verse.
 - 2. Return the RBfK all clear reference in response to the RBfK all clear verse given to you indicating your room is free of trouble and clear to begin the exit/or end of LOCK-DOWN instructions.
 - 3. If your room is **NOT** free of trouble (i.e. one or more intruders are hiding in your room) respond to the RBfK all clear verse with a WRONG reference. This will signal to the emergency responder that you need special assistance.



 - 3. If your area is **NOT** free of trouble (i.e. one or more intruders are hiding in your area) respond to the RBfK all clear verse with a WRONG reference. This will signal to the emergency responder that you need special assistance.
- 13. After getting the ALL CLEAR protocol, do nothing until given instructions.
- 14. If told to evacuate by a Children's Ministry Lead or an identifiable emergency personnel, Rope Up, gather the Solo Emergency Backpack (repack the wool), radio, and class roster (if available) move out to the East Patio (unless told differently by a Children's Ministry Lead or an identifiable emergency personnel ONLY) and wait for help and parents.
- 15. In case of inclement weather, remove and layer the Mylar and wool blankets from the Solo Emergency Backpack and place them over the kids, Mylar first, wool second.
- 16. When parents come to pick up their children, make sure you match tag numbers and place child's tag on the Child Release Form (last page on clipboard) before allowing children to be released (see attached example at the end of this document or manual).





A red light is an indication the environment has an imminent and actual threat and is unsafe. All precautions should be taken to protect the kids and survive.

- 1. As quickly as possible send someone to shut and lock East and West stairwell doors..
- 2. Gather the Solo Emergency Backpack, the radio, and the class roster (if available), and do a quick head count of total kids and Dream Team.
- 3. Remove and two people (adults first) put on safety vests out of the Primary Backpack.
- 4. Grab the fire extinguishers to use as a potential defensive weapon (see instruction video at rbfk.net).
- 5. Move the kids into the upstairs restroom areas.
- 6. Have kids assume the Tornado Tuck position and cover with wool blanket.
- 7. Turn off ALL room lights.
- 8. Black out all video projectors and TVs
- 9. Post adults between doors and kids
- 10. Get prepared to **aggressively fight** (hear me say destroy) any threat that presents itself. Your goal is for you and the kids to survive this awful and evil event. If evil is breaking into your room, your survival is totally up to you.
- 11. When the situation is given an "ALL CLEAR" the following will happen:
 - 1. You will hear a "Return to Status GREEN" over the radio. Confirm you heard the call. This does **NOT** clear the situation, but only indicates the CM Lead is coming around to clear your room.
 - 2. The Children's Ministry Lead will come by and unlock the stairwell door. Do NOT unlock the door from the inside wait for the Children's Ministry Lead to unlock the door. Stay in place until the Children's Ministry Lead or an identifiable emergency personnel has given the RBfK all clear verse.
 - 3. Return the RBfK all clear reference in response to the RBfK all clear verse given to you indicating your room is free of trouble and clear to begin the exit/or end of LOCK-DOWN instructions.

- 4. If your room is **NOT** free of trouble (i.e. one or more intruders are hiding in your room) respond to the RBfK all clear verse with a WRONG reference. This will signal to the emergency responder that you need special assistance.
- 12. Do a kid count to make sure all kids are present and accounted for and no injuries have occurred. If the need arises, use the first aid kit from the Solo Emergency Backpack until help arrives.
- 13. After getting the ALL CLEAR protocol, do nothing until given instructions.
- 14. If told to evacuate by a Children's Ministry Lead or an identifiable emergency personnel, Rope Up, gather the Solo Emergency Backpack (repack the wool), radio, and class roster (if available) and move out the Primary Evacuation Route, East stairwell door, to the East Patio (unless told differently by a Children's Ministry Lead or an identifiable emergency personnel ONLY) and wait for help and parents.
- 15. In case of inclement weather, remove and layer the Mylar and wool blanket from the Blanket Backpack and place them over the kids.
- 16. Continually hold up the **GREEN** laminated sign or if nighttime activate **GREEN** glow stick from the Primary Backpack if everyone is present and accounted for and <u>no</u> immediate attention is required.
- 17. Continually hold up the **RED** laminated sign or if nighttime activate **RED** glow stick from the Primary Backpack if <u>NOT</u> all kids are present and accounted for or if immediate attention is required.
- 18. When parents come to pick up their children, make sure you match tag numbers and place child's tag on the Child Release Form (last page on clipboard) before allowing children to be released (see attached example at the end of this document or manual).
- 19. If no tag, have parents step to the end of the line while they obtain their driver's license or photo ID. Get the CM Lead to verify parent ID and obtain parent signature on the Child Release Form (on clipboard) before releasing the child.
- 20. Once all the kids from your class have been released check with other classes to see if you can assist.
